1. Select one of the above topics.
2. For the topic you select, select 16 of the 26 individually-numbered formulations in Section 26.
3. For each of the 16 formulations you select, provide an example that can be used to analyze your topic. Do not repeat examples. Each formulation will be worth 3 points.
4. Select the formulation that you feel is most important or most relevant in analyzing the topic you chose. This formulation will be worth 5, rather than 3, points.
